- 1.2. ALL BIDS MUST BE SUBMITTED ON THE OFFICIAL FORMS PROVIDED (NOT TO BE RE-TYPED) OR IN THE MANNER PRESCRIBED IN THE BID DOCUMENT.
- 1.3. THIS BID IS SUBJECT TO THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT POLICY FRAMEWORK ACT, 2000 AND THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT REGULATIONS, THE GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (GCC) AND, IF APPLICABLE, ANY OTHER SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and

includes all applicable taxes;

- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) "the Act" means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- (ii) To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- . The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid documents and may not be amended.
- . Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific Bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

TABLE OF CLAUSES

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General Conditions of

1. Definitions

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- 1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4 **"Corrupt practice"** means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5 **"Countervailing duties"** are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidised by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6 "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognised new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7 "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8 "**Delivery**" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9 "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10 "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
- 1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.

1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition. 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract. 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract. 1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured. 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place. 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities. 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service. 1.20 **"Project site**," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents. 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods. 1.22 "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa. 1.23 "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract. 1.24 "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract. 1.25 "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing. 2. Application 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents. 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works. 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply. 3. General 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non- refundable fee for

documents may be charged.

- 2.1. The Department is committed to provide quality health care services that are accessible, comprehensive, integrated, sustainable and affordable for the life of people in Limpopo Province.
- 2.2. To achieve the above, the Department among others requires transportation, processing and academic reporting of Histopathology samples including training.
- 2.3. The Limpopo Department of Health has 12 Forensic Pathology units in the province. Cases that are handled include police related shooting cases and other custody related deaths, explosion related deaths, multiple gunshot cases, fatal aircraft accidents, any mass fatality from road traffic accidents, fatal child abuse cases and sudden unexpected infant deaths, procedure related deaths, other complicated high-profile cases etc.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1. Limpopo Forensic Pathology Service renders Medico-Legal investigation of death, the main objective of determining the cause of death is to assist the criminal justice system.
- 3.2. As part of the autopsy examination process, the Departmental Forensic Pathology Medical Practitioners (Specialist Forensic Pathologists, Registrars, and Medical Officers) will collect tissue from the body for further macroscopic and microscopic examination to assist in determining the cause of death. The Forensic Pathology Services is guided accordingly by the Inquest Act No. 58 of 1959.
- 3.3. Sampling for Histopathological examination takes place in 20-30% of the cases that require a diagnosis, confirmation of diagnosis or exclusion of diagnosis of the cause of death from the autopsy examination performed by the Forensic Pathology Services.

4. SCOPE OF WORK

The following will constitute the scope of work to be provided by the appointed service provider(s).

- 4.1. The Limpopo Department of Health's primary objective in issuing this RFB is to enter into agreement with a successful bidder(s) who will achieve the following:
 - 4.1.1 Provision of histopathology tissue containers of various sizes, lids and labels.
 - 4.1.2 The service provider shall provide buffered formalin and other preservatives that may be required as and when need arises.
 - 4.1.3 The service provider shall be accredited with the South African National Accreditation System

(SANAS).

4.2. Collection of tissue samples:

4.2.1. The service provider shall collect forensic tissue samples from all twelve (12) facilities mentioned below:

4.3. Processing

- 4.3.1. The service provider shall process and prepare tissue samples in Haematoxylin and Eosin stains.
- 4.3.2. Other appropriate special stains shall be done in consultation with the Department's specialist forensic pathologist/registrar, as and when the need arises.
- 4.3.3. The service provider shall provide the slides in suitable and secured slide containers (to avoid damage) and collect back the slide containers after use.
 - =-0 Tissue samples, blocks and slides remain the property of the Department of Health and should be returned as and when need arises and at the end of the contract.
- 4.3.4. The service provider should have enough storage for tissues, blocks and slides for the duration of the contract.

4.4. Reporting

- **4.4.1.** Reporting of all cases shall be done by a suitably qualified Histopathologist /Anatomical pathologist, with current HPCSA registration in the same discipline.
- 4.4.2. The opinion of a forensic pathologist may be required, the service provider needs to demonstrate access to a qualified forensic pathologist.
- 4.4.3. In the case of disagreement on any report, the opinion of an independent forensic pathologist shall be sought at the expense of the service provider.

4.4.4. Reports shall be made available through email and hard copies delivered to facilities listed in 4.2.1 above.

4.5. Histopathology Discussion on Special cases.

4.5.1. The Histopathologist/Anatomical Pathologist shall be available for discussion of special cases that require histopathology specialist expertise.

4.6. **Provision of training.**

The service provider shall be expected to partake in histopathology training of year 1 and 2 of registrars and support of other registrars for the duration of the contract the department of health shall provide the accredited training program by HPCSA and the college to the appointed bidder.
- 4.6.2. During year 1 of training, the service provider will teach virtually and in person and conduct microscopy tutorials on-site at Pietersburg Forensic Pathology Services.
- 4.6.3. During year 2 of training, the registrars will need to rotate within the histopathology facility on a full-time basis. The service provider must therefore demonstrate the availability of proper office space and equipment.

- 8.4. The department reserves the right to appoint one or more service providers utilizing point scoring rankings.
